## Problem 3

1. For the following Initial Value Problem (IVP) of order 1 :

$$
y^{\prime}+\frac{2}{x} y=\frac{\cos (x)}{x^{2}}, \quad y(\pi)=0
$$

2. Find the largest interval in which the solution of the IVP is certain to exists and to be unique.
3. Find the solutions of the homogeneous equation $y^{\prime}+\frac{2}{x} y=0$ on that interval.
4. Then, by using the method of variation of parameter, find the solutions of the complete equation $y^{\prime}+\frac{2}{x} y=\frac{\cos (x)}{x^{2}}$.
5. Quickly but properly check that the functions you give as solutions are indeed solutions, by the method you like.
